This program includes a full-compliment of children's services with treatment areas at the Main hospital and nearby at Carrie Tingley Children's Outpatient Hospital. The nearby Veteran's Administration Medical Center and Sandoval Regional Medical Center provide additional sites for resident rotations.

Rotations are typically from July-October. Applicants should apply through VSLO/VSAS and will be contacted regarding approval once applications are reviewed.
